OSBE: Underfloor heating is still a parquet topic

There is still a lot of uncertainty concerning the use of wooden flooring above underfloor heating systems. Worries have to be addressed if parquet is to expand its role in the flooring market. This, at least, is the view of OSBE, the dutch producer of parquet underlays.
